AMERICAN & CANADIAN WHISKEY

Combined with different distilling and ageing techniques whiskey from across the pond is emerging as a generation's favourite.

Since 1923, Suntory has been renowned as the founding house of Japanese Whisky. Founder Shinjiro Torii built Japan's first malt whisky distillery in Yamazaki, and the Suntory legacy continued with Torii's son and Suntory's second Master Blender, Keizo Saji, who continued to establish distilleries including the Hakushu Distillery.

Embodying the harmony that exists between Japanese nature and Japanese people, House of Suntory whiskies are subtle, refined, and complex.

LAPHROAIG

Laphroaig's arguably divisive, smoky, and earthy profile has not been replicated anywhere else on earth and stands today as a flagship of Islay Single Malt Scotch Whisky.

THE GLENROTHES

The Glenrothes distillery has been quietly producing an authentic and soft single malt since 1879 in a hidden valley, deep in the heart of the Speyside region. Drawing the water from the Burn of Rothes, there is a certain rustic elegance surrounding the distillery that many whisky connoisseurs have appreciated over the last decade.

SCOTTISH GRAIN WHISKY

Grain whisky can be based on a variety of grains-not solely malted barley- and is distilled in huge continuous column stills. This speeds up the distillation process and creates a light and delicate spirit. Most of this production will be used for the Blended Whisky industry however sometimes a few extraordinary bottles of single grain whisky can be found.

This might very well be one of the last bottles of this long-closed distillery. As most of its production was used as a component for blended whiskies, only a few barrels remained to be released as a Single Grain Whisky. Aged entirely in American oak casks, notes of dried flowers, custard and orange oil are very evident.

IRISH WHISKEY

Traditionally closely linked to Scotch however very different in style. A mixture of malted & unmalted barley and a combination of pot stills and column stills give Irish whiskies their pronounced personality.

As opposed to single malt whiskies-where the malt whisky can only come from one distillery- blended malts generally have more freedom when it comes to blending and can therefore offer new and extremely unique flavour profiles.
